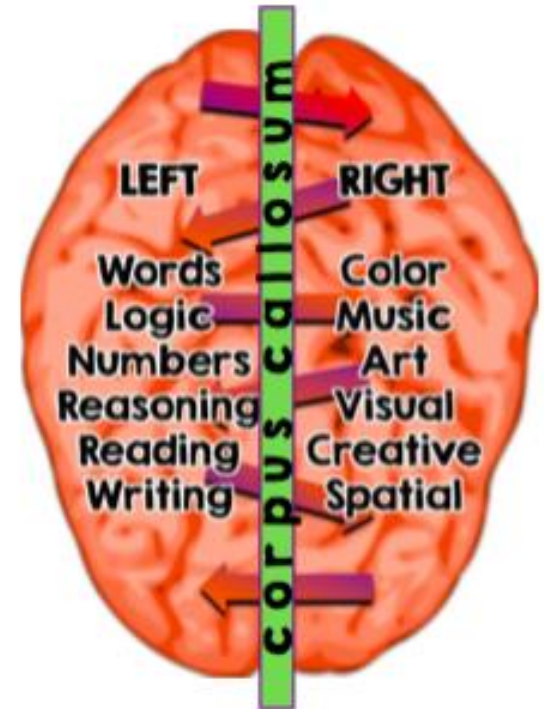
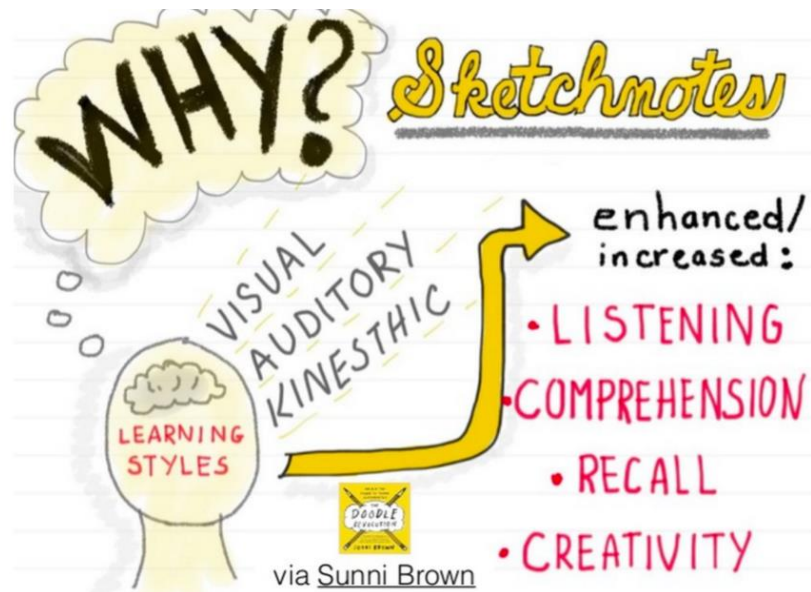


Visual Note-Taking Tips:

- ☑ There are NO major rules to visual note taking. Your notes are for YOU!
- ☑ By using BOTH sides of your brain, YOU process what you are learning so you can REMEMBER and UNDERSTAND! Doodling also helps you FOCUS and helps calm you down when you feel anxious.

INFORMATION

☑ Know what information you are going to take notes on:

- this is where ANNOTATING the text comes in ..

- but... you can use visual note-taking strategies for many things: movies, shows, blogs, magazine articles, presentations, lectures, to help you brainstorm, etc!

WRITE IMPORTANT INFO

Add the text parts of your notes:

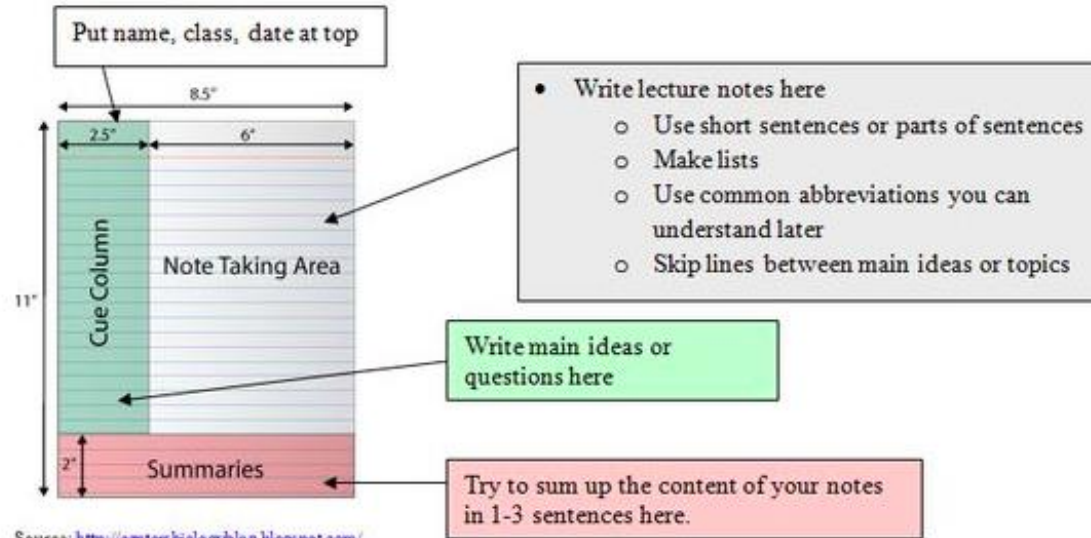
- take the information you annotated and TRANSFER it to your notes

- Be sure to **ORGANIZE** your notes in a way that makes sense to you

- This is where using a more specific note-taking method will help (notes outline, Cornell notes, top-down notes, mind map, or other type of graphic organizer) comes in handy

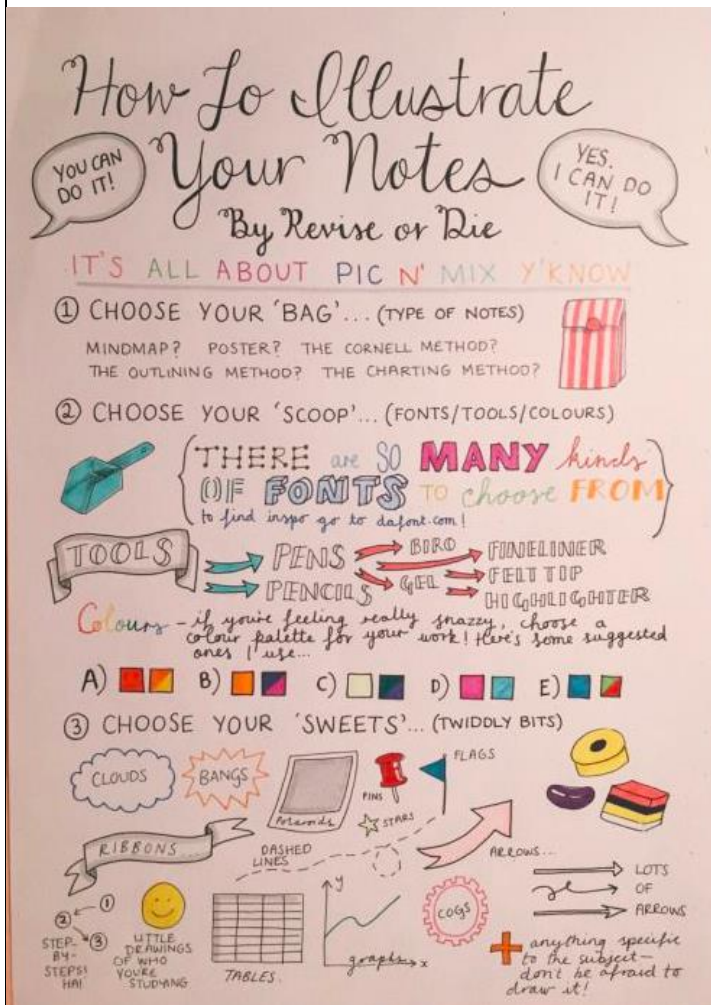

3b FONTS, BULLET POINTS, FRAMES and ARROWS

As you record important information, don't forget:

- leave space to add images and additional information
- you do not need to write word for word or even in full sentences
- using different fonts, size, and colors will help you organize your information
- use bullet, "containers" like boxes, frames, and thought bubbles
- use arrows to connect ideas and concepts



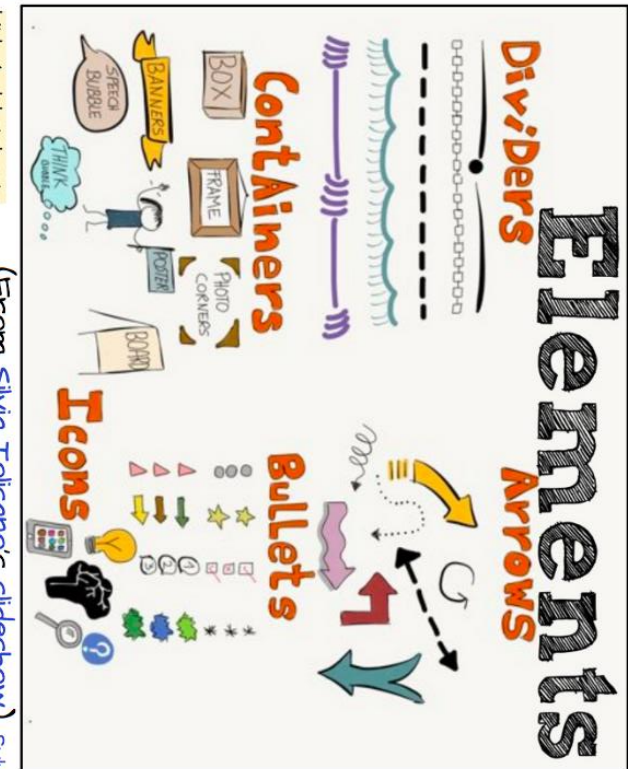

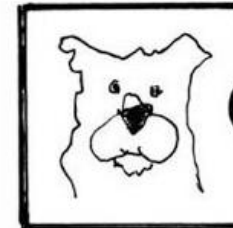
IDEAS, NOT ART!

Sketchnotes are about capturing and sharing ideas, not about art.

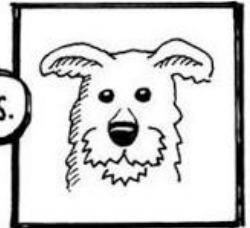


SKETCHNOTES ARE A WAY TO THINK ON PAPER USING IMAGES & WORDS.
